ACKNOWLEDGEMENT

I am delighted to know that SAHARA Nepal is celebrating its 27th annual general assembly and annual function. It's been 2 years of collaboration with SAHARA Nepal as one of the program implementing partners in Jhapa and Morang for the BISWAS (Building Trust and Confidence among NTD-Affected People) project. The BISWAS project is funded by FAIRMED Switzerland and jointly implemented by local partner NGOs together with Government of Nepal (GoN) in Jhapa, Morang, and Sunsari districts.

Through our partnership, we have been able to train 645 health workers and a total of 170 female community health volunteers (FCHVs) on neglected tropical diseases (NTDs), 17 nursing staff on maternal and neonatal health-related skills, and 8 nursing staffs on skilled birth attendants (SBAs). To strengthen the service part, SAHARA has provided its support to supply essential equipment worth NPR 3 million to needy health institutions in its project districts. Similarly, 954 HFOMC members were trained and enhanced their management capacity to manage their health institutions effectively. Through FCHVs and health mother groups, SAHARA Nepal was able to sensitize 5064 community members on NTDs and maternal and neonatal health by using the SATH tool. More than 21,000 schoolchildren have been sensitized to NTDs, especially dengue, lymphatic filariasis, and WASH. A total of 442 marginalized families residing in LNOB areas of Jhapa and Morang have received bed nets from the project.

We found SAHARA Nepal a very professional and well-managed partner organization in Koshi Province, which has a very good network and working relationship at the local, district, and province levels with the government and community. So, we anticipate our long-term partnership also in future for the common goal and sustainability of health and development programs in this region.

At last, but not least I thank the entire SAHARA project team, management and board of SAHARA Nepal for their valuable contribution to improving the health status of people in Jhapa and Morang districts, and I wish your very successful annual general assembly.

Country Director Action Against Hunger (ACF) Nepal Message for 2022-2023 Partnership Programme with Sahara Nepal

Dear Partners, Supporters, and Team Members,

I am thrilled to share with you the incredible progress and achievements of our partnership with Sahara Nepal for the year 2022-2023. This year has been marked by tremendous dedication and hard work from our teams, and it is my privilege to provide an overview of our accomplishments and future endeavours. Our collaborative efforts have already yielded substantial results: through Bamboo Reforestation: We successfully planted 4,500 bamboo saplings across 6 hectares of land in Belaka Municipality. This initiative not only contributes to environmental conservation but also supports local communities through sustainable bamboo utilization. Engaging in Innovative Bamboo Sapling Production: Our bamboo nut-cut technology allowed us to produce an impressive 6,000 bamboo saplings, promoting sustainable conservation practices and income generation within communities. Launching Water, Sanitation, and Hygiene (WASH) project, contributing to government policy on "One Door, One Tap" aimed at ensuring access to clean and safe water for 1,050 households, designed and well underway, bringing us closer to our goal of improving access to clean drinking water and sanitation.

ACF and Sahara partnership embarked on several key community led research studies and baseline to support community development and strengthening local government.

- A. Disaster Preparedness and Response Plan:** We are working diligently on developing a comprehensive plan for Belaka and Udayapurgadhi municipalities to enhance their resilience in the face of disasters in 2023.
- B. Local Disaster and Climate Resilience Plan:** Our joint efforts are focused on creating a resilience plan for Belaka and Udayapurgadhi municipalities to mitigate the impact of climate change and disasters on vulnerable communities.
- C. Neglected and Underutilized Crops and Spices (NUCS) Project:** The baseline survey conducted in 2023 is a crucial step toward promoting the cultivation of these crops and enhancing food security in the region.
- D. Water and Sanitation (WASH) Project:** Through our Knowledge, Attitude, and Practice (KAP) mapping survey, we are gaining valuable insights into the WASH needs of Rasuwa and Nuwakot districts, which will guide our future efforts.

Our commitment to capacity development remains unwavering, and we continue to facilitate training and workshops on Water, Sanitation, and Hygiene (WASH), Disaster Risk Reduction (DRR), and Food Security and Livelihoods (FSL) to empower local communities and enhance their resilience.

Furthermore, Partnership agreement with NUCS (Neglected and Underutilized Crops and Spices) on started on January 3, 2023, extending until July 2, 2025, for Udayapur district. This partnership holds great potential for transforming agricultural practices and livelihoods. Another partnership agreement with our Water and Sanitation (WASH) program, signed on May 9, 2023, extending until May 8, 2025, for Rasuwa and Nuwakot districts. This collaboration will further our efforts to improve access to clean water and sanitation facilities in these areas.

As we look ahead to the coming year, I am filled with optimism about the positive impact we will continue to make together. Your unwavering support and dedication are at the heart of our successes, and I extend my deepest gratitude to each and every one of you. 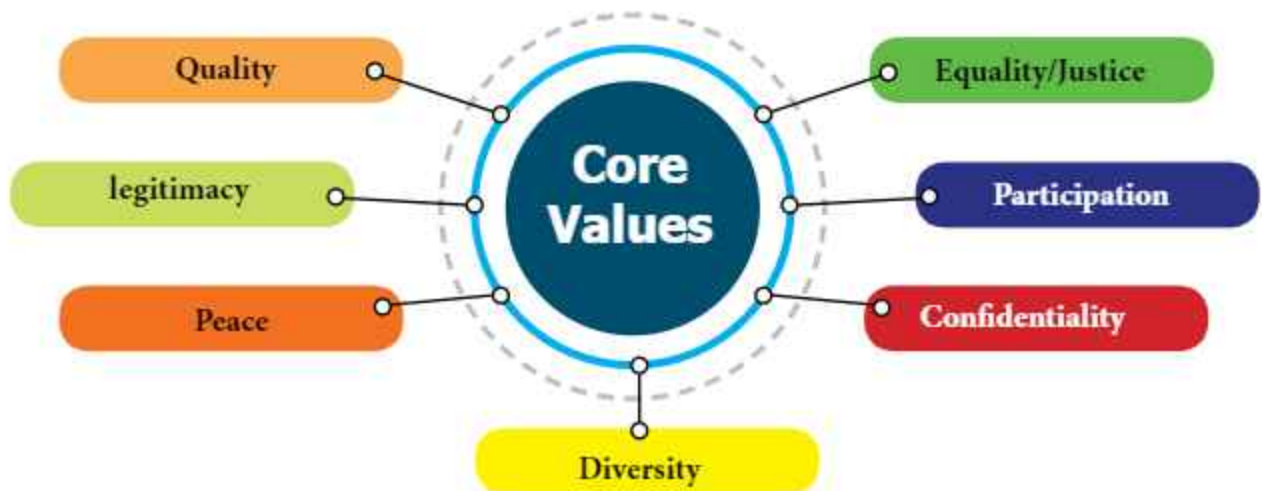

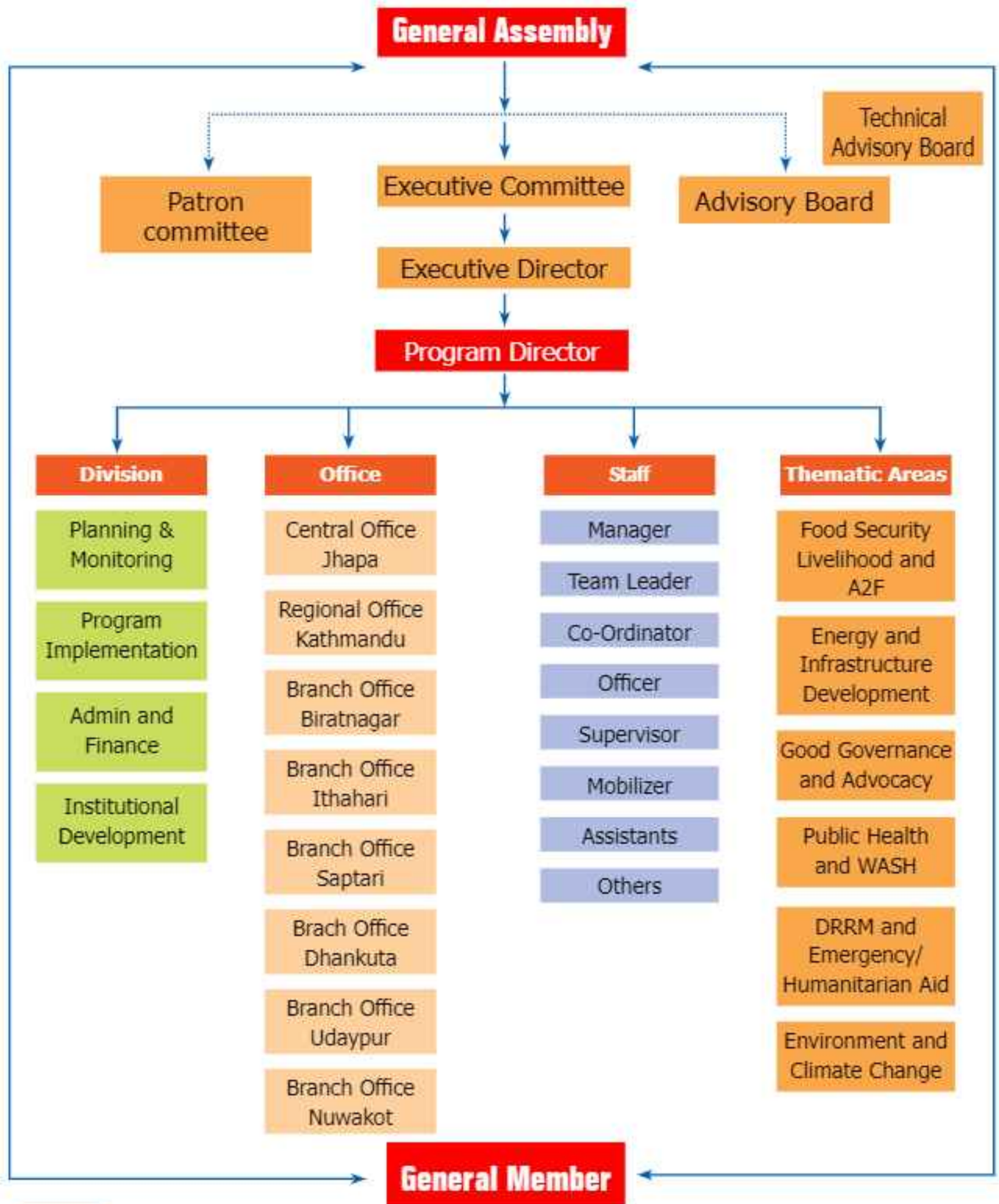
- ❖ Improve the socio-economic condition of poor and marginalized communities and enabling them to food sufficiency and increased income via agricultural and non-agricultural inputs.

- Support socially displaced, elderly people, disabled and conflict victims to rehabilitate and reintegrate in the community.



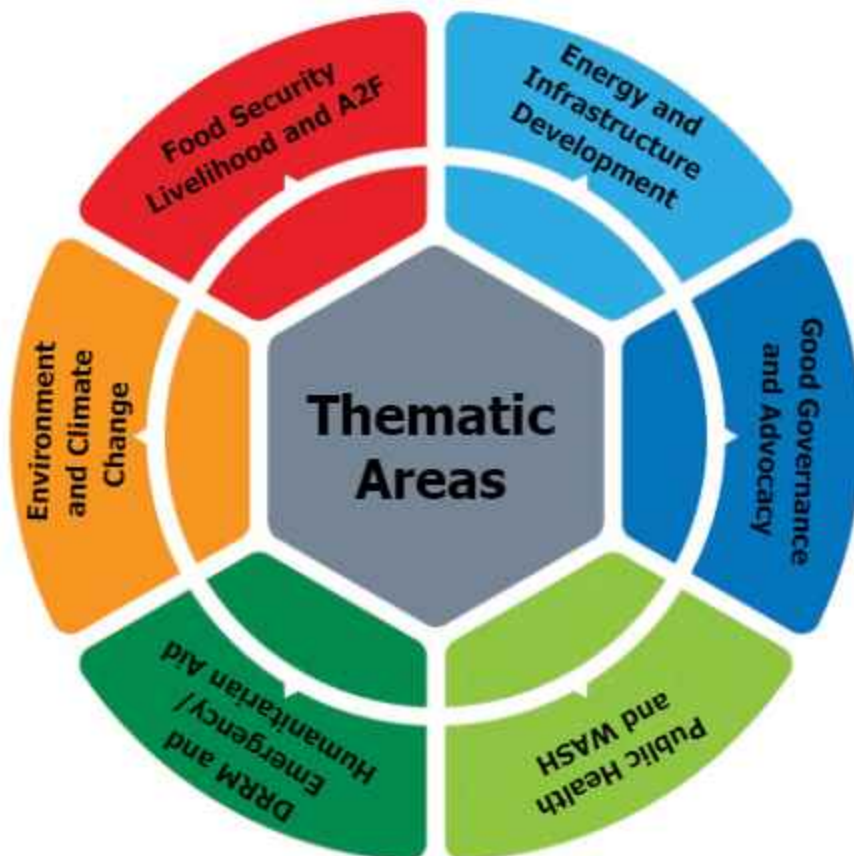
संगठनात्मक ढाँचा Organogram



Governance

The General Assembly is the apex governing Body of the Organization. It oversees and controls the direction of Vision, Mission, Goal and Objectives (VMGO) of the Organization. The Assembly comprises of 40 General Members. These General Members elect the Executive Board. The Executive Committee comprises of Chairperson, Vice Chairperson, Secretary, Vice Secretary, Treasurer and 10 other Members.

The Executive Committee is entrusted to formulate and implement the policies of the Organization. Further, the Executive Committee monitors and evaluates the programs and projects being implemented. The tenure of the Committee is four years. The Executive Committee delegates its authority to the Secretary for day-to-day operation and handling of activities within the Organization. वार्षिक प्रगति प्रतिवेदन

भूमिका

यस संस्थाको २७ औं वार्षिक साधारण सभामा पाल्नु हुने प्रमुख अतिथि, सम्पूर्ण आमन्त्रित अतिथि, संरक्षक, सल्लाहकार तथा सम्पूर्ण सदस्य महानुभावहरूलाई हार्दिक स्वागत गर्दछु।

अहिले हामी संस्था स्थापनाको २८ औं वर्षमा प्रवेश गर्दैछौं। सानो कामको थालनीबाट पनि सामाजिक क्षेत्रमा यति ठूलो महत्वपूर्ण उपलब्धि हासिल हुन्छ भनेर शुरुवाती वर्षहरूमा सोचिएको पनि थिएन। तर, निरन्तरको प्रयास र इमानदारीपूर्वक जिम्मेवारी लिएर काम गर्दै अगाडि बढेमा सफलता प्राप्त हुँदोरहेछ। यस संस्थाले गरिबी न्यूनीकरण गर्ने राज्यको मूल लक्ष्यलाई सहयोग पुऱ्याउन सशक्तीकरण, जीविकोपार्जन, जनस्वास्थ्य, मानवीय सेवा तथा पूर्वाधार विकासको क्षेत्रमा कार्य गरिरहेको छ। यसले खासगरी समुदायबाट उपेक्षित, पछाडि पारिएका र बञ्चितिकरणमा परेका वर्गहरूको अधिकार, आर्थिक जीवनस्तर सुधार र मानवीय सहयोगको लागि हजारौं परिवारलाई सहयोग पुऱ्याउँदै आएको छ।

मुलुकको वर्तमान अवस्था

नेपालको संविधान २०७२ ले संघीयताको परिकल्पना गर्दै संघ, प्रदेश र स्थानीय तहसहितको ३ तहको सरकारको व्यवस्था गरी अधिकार समेत बाँडपत्राँड गरेको छ। संविधान बर्माँजिम संघ, प्रदेश र स्थानीय तह बीचको सम्बन्ध सहकारिता, सहअस्तित्व र समन्वयको सिद्धान्तमा आधारित हुने व्यवस्था छ। संविधानको कार्यान्वयनसँगै नेपाल स्थायित्वको बाटोमा हिँडेको छ। तीनै तहको सरकारको निर्वाचन सफलतापूर्वक सम्पन्न भएका छन्। जनतामा राजनीतिक सचेतना अभिवृद्धि भई स्थानीयस्तरमा

विकास निर्माणको थालनी भएका छन्। स्थानीय सरकारले आफ्नो लागि आवश्यक पर्ने नीति-नियम तथा कानूनको निर्माण गरिरहेका छन्। यद्यपी देशमा महिला, दलित, सिमान्तकृत, पछाडि पारिएको समुदाय, अल्पसंख्यक र अपांगता भएका व्यक्तिलाई राज्यको मूल प्रवाहीकरणमा ल्याउन राज्यलाई अभ्य चुनौति यथावत छ। अभ्य पनि लक्षित वर्गले राज्यबाट प्रदान गरिने सेवा सुविधामा पहुँच स्थापित गरी आफ्नो अधिकारमा दाबी गर्न नसकेको अवस्था छ। वास्तविक लक्षित वर्गमा सुशासनको प्रत्याभूत गराउन राज्यलाई चुनौतिको विषय बनेको छ।

मुलुकका तीनै तहका सरकारका जनप्रतिनिधिहरूले जनताको हितमा महत्वपूर्ण कार्य गर्न नसकेबाट मुलुक सही दिशातर्फ हिँड्न नसकेको साथै दण्डाहिनता, भ्रष्टाचार आदि जस्ता घटनात्रम बढ्दै गइरहेको देखिन्छ। साथै, तीन तहको सरकारबीच समन्वय नहुँदा र जनप्रतिनिधिहरूमा काम गर्ने इच्छा शक्तिको अभाव भई स्थानीय सरकारबाट हुनुपर्ने शैक्षिक, आर्थिक, भौतिक र लैङ्गिक तथा सामाजिक समावेशिकरणको मुद्दा समेत ओभरेलमा पर्दै गएको जनगुनासाहरु सुनिन थालेका छन्।

वर्तमान संविधानले सामाजिक संघ-संस्था खोल्न पाउने अधिकारलाई मौलिक हक अन्तर्गत समावेश गरेको छ। वर्तमान १५औं योजना (२०७६-०८१) ले व्यावसायिक, जवाफदेही र पारदर्शी सामुदायिक तथा गैरसरकारी संस्था भन्ने सोचसहित यी संस्थालाई मर्यादित, पारदर्शी र व्यवस्थित रुपमा परिचालन गर्दै सामाजिक तथा आर्थिक विकास गर्ने लक्ष्य लिएको छ।

विभिन्न सामाजिक आन्दोलनलाई सशक्त नेतृत्वसहित सही दिशामा डोऱ्याउन, नागरिकहरूको संविधान प्रदत्त मौलिक हकहरूको कार्यान्वयन गराउन तथा सीमान्तकृत समुदायको आवाजलाई गुञ्जयामान बनाउन नेपालमा सामाजिक संघ-संस्थाहरूको भूमिका महत्वपूर्ण मानिन्छ। नापत्ररहित स्वयम्सेवी भावनाले ओतप्रोत भएका सामाजिक

Project Background

Since April 1, 2017, in partnership with the Asia Foundation, the (Sub national Governance Program -SNGP) in 4 districts of Province No. 1: Jhapa, Morang, Sunsari, and Dhankuta has been completed. The program has now been expanded to all the 14 districts of Koshi Province, in the second year of the second phase of the SNGP program, which is scheduled to run from April 2023 to March 2024. The main objective of the project is to, identify potential conflicts arising at the local level, especially those related to federalism and governance, and with various conflict transformations strengthen the local and state governments, to establish peace and facilitate both local and provincial governments in the amendment of the policies and their effective implementation for access to healthcare services and employment in accordance with the constitution, through dialogue. The dialogue group has been working in this area since its inception.

Major Activities :

- Along with the implementation of federalism, the dialogue committee will coordinate with the three tiers of government and provide necessary support and facilitation to the government in the field of local and provincial government governance.
- Creating/ managing a common forum for conflict resolution and transformation through dialogue

- Documenting good practice in dialogue facilitation.
- Conducting dialogue management skills and leadership development training for the dialogue group members.
- Mobilizing media personnel for conflict resolution and transformation.

Major Achievements

- Succeeded in allocating 40 crore 10 lakhs budget for the financial year 2080/81 to be spent equally for tea farmers and workers from the Koshi government, in order to address the problem of the tea sector for the first time in an institutional manner with the slogan "Production in hand, cash in hand". The government has provided the highest ever 1500 metric tons of chemical fertilizers for the tea sector. The employees and workers working in 7 tea expansion schemes under the Government of Nepal have been listed in the Social Security Fund according to the Labor Act and Contribution Based Social Security Act by The National Tea and Coffee Development Board.
- After solving the issue of ethnic identity and existence of Santhal caste, 'Shanthal' started to be used instead of 'Satar' in the government documents and statistics.
- After coordination between the three tiers of government in Koshi Hospital improvement, Biratnagar Metropolitan City is working on parking arrangements, District Traffic Police Office Morang and District Administration Office Morang are assisting in crowd control. With the involvement of the civil society in the cleanliness of the hospital, there was a weekly cleaning campaign, a help desk was established in the hospital, which made it easier for more than 1300 patients who came to the hospital daily. Ambulance tracking system has been put into operation and work has started.
- Coordination committee of deputy chiefs of Jhapa and Morang has been built, review and planning meetings are held regularly in 2 months.
- Itahari sub-metropolitan started listing work

for 'Gramthan' protection and succeeded in forming 30 'Gramthan' protection committees in Ramdhuni and 13 more in Itahari.

- The provincial and Federal assembly elections held on November 4, 2079 were successfully completed with enthusiastic participation in a clean, free, fair, transparent, dignified, reliable, orderly and fearless environment. The dialogue groups of Jhapa, Morang, Sunsari and Dhankuta districts had then interacted with the representatives of various parties, regions and groups of the district.

- Positive social change can be envisioned through dialogue between individuals or groups.
- If the stakeholders are made responsible and accountable for the policies and rules created by the state, it can be brought to the implementation level.



Project Background

A large part of Nepal's population represents rural areas. Since almost half of the rural roads are not operational due to the lack of bridges, the rural people are not able to access essential service facilities and opportunities. It is a bitter reality that rural people cannot increase their access to schools, bazaars, health centers, etc. as service recipients due to not being able to cross the river safely. In view of the suspension bridge strategy of the government of Nepal to make commuting easier by providing reliable transportation facilities to the local people through the construction and operation of the suspension bridge with the active participation of the local people, the government of Nepal aims to support poverty alleviation by increasing access to basic and social services and financial resources of the local community.

Sahara Nepal provides technical services including surveys, designs, preparation of DPRs and construction supervision and social support to the User Committees for the construction and maintenance of the SSTB (Short Span Trail Bridge) bridges in different municipalities of Jhapa District.

Objective:

- The main objective of the program is to contribute towards poverty reduction through the improvement of access to social and basic services and economic resources and opportunities of the local people by building trail bridges within one hour detour.

Major Activities

The major activities consist of facilitation and providing social and technical support in the construction of trail bridges. For this purpose, the following activities are undertaken:

- Conducted a pre-feasibility study of trail bridge sites.
- Collected social data/information, public hearing & formation of user committees.
- Conducted detailed survey and prepare design and estimate of the bridges.

Project Background

The projects have been implemented in Jhapa and Morang districts of Koshi Province. The blended approach has been adopted integrating the local governments, private sector and local communities to anticipate the projects. This particular approach along with assets based community development and owner driven model is one of the acclaimed approaches for sustainability prospects in Nepal. The projects have been entirely designed anticipating on community involvement, family ownership and prioritized use of local resources.

The integrated partnership modality is the one which has been agreed between Habitat for Humanity Nepal (HFHN) and Sahara Nepal under which Utthansil Aawas- Resilient Settlement, Digo Samudaaya, Resilient Sustainable Inclusive Easter Nepal- RISEN, Habitat Young Leaders Build, Hilti and Community Housing projects have been and are under execution. In the last projects between 2018 and 2021, ACF has collaborated directly with the Rural Municipalities of Amachodigmo and Kispang. NSR-MI, RSVC, RUPWS and WASH-GSS projects were successfully implemented and handed over to the users through directly involvement of Local Government.

Project Background

ACF and Sahara Nepal have jointed initiated the project in two rural municipalities one at Kispang Rural Municipality, Nuwakot and Aamachodingmo Rural Municipality Rasuwa in the plan to connect water supply networks allied on the right bank of upper Trishuli River Basin. This project aims to renovate and improve six-water supply schemes along with household tap connection, installation of mini Grey Water treatment plant, and hygiene promotion. The project has planned to reach out to provide water supply connections to 1,051 households in the above-mentioned municipalities with cash contribution of Rural Municipalities.

The major objective of Project is to provide access and address the need of safe drinkable water through water supply infrastructures, household connection, water station construction and WSUC ownership. Besides project also aimed to ensure WASH through grey water management and community awareness."

Major Activities

The major activities to be accomplish by the project is as below :

- Construction / renovation of 6 improved networks with home connections and overflow for irrigation
- Legally register and Construct 6 water supply



- schemes (Kispang - Archale, Manegaun and Puranogaun and in Aamacchodingmo - Gatlang, Brajam, Pajung) with proper reservoir and transmission/distribution.
- Construction of 6 ecological treatment plants (planted reeds with horizontal flow under the surface) with flushing and upstream grids
- Household connection campaign - one house one tap construction (Reach to 1051 HH with one house and one tap provision)
- Community promotion sessions focusing on hand washing with soap, proper water use, irrigation and open defecation prevention
- Community promotion sessions focusing on river protection, water quality, environmental river management, grey water use for irrigation
- Setting up the users' committee and provide training for capacity building programs for water supply user committee and selected VMWs
- Technical training for the plant operation (for the users' committee)
- Collection of seed money for further maintenance and operation of water supply scheme
- Construction of 6 ecological treatment plants (planted reeds with horizontal flow under the surface) with flushing and upstream grids.

Major Achievements

The major achievements of the project as of now is as below

- A Detailed engineering survey has been completed from which BOQ for construction has been finalized and following to which the tender process for construction of water supply scheme has been completed.
- Procurement and vendor selection process for non local material has been completed and construction on Manegaun WSS is ongoing.

- Water supply and User committee registration has been completed where every committee

- Besides team are upon towards planning the construction work of other WSS in the coming days.

- Gaining and retaining public trust need a lot of fulfill commitments and speedy work completion
- Regular follow up and coordination with the government and local leaders is the most to smoothen the working progress.

Sahara Nepal's Support during COVID-19 Pandemic

The COVID-19 pandemic has led to a dramatic loss of human life worldwide and presents an unprecedented challenge to public health, food systems and the world of work. The economic and social disruption caused by the pandemic is devastating; tens of millions of people are at risk of falling into extreme poverty.

Millions of enterprises face an existential threat. Nearly half of the world's 3.3 billion global work force are at risk of losing their livelihoods. Informal economy workers are particularly vulnerable because the majority lacks social protection and access to quality health care and have lost access to productive assets. Without the means to earn an income during lockdowns, many are unable to feed themselves and their families. For most, no income means no food, or, at best, less food and less nutritious food (Joint statement by ILO, FAO, IFAD and WHO).

During the pandemic and unprecedented lockdown caused by the government of Nepal; Sahara Nepal initiated a campaign to

support the government and general public with basic health and food was appreciated by all. Sahara Nepal initiated a campaign called "EK KA LAGI EK ABHIYAN (One for the One campaign)" was a successful with mass participation. Some to the activities carried by the campaign are highlighted below:

- Campaign on WASH program was carried out in all the six districts of Sahara Nepal working area
- Distribution of face mask and sanitizer along with PPE
- Relief materials provided to poor and marginalized families of the communities

- PCR lab established at Kankai Municipality
- Provided cash support to Palinkas
- Supported in managing quarantines
- Supported in the establishment of Oxygen Bank in Jhapa District

The above-mentioned activities were carried out in close coordination with the local people, CBO's and local government as to involve them in the mass campaign and the objective of the camping was to feed the needy.

Meet **MS. SUJANA PATHAK** –
Member of Ananda Farmers' Group and
land owner of Ananda Tole Bamboo
Nursery, Belaka Municipality, Udayapur
district, Koshi Province, Nepal

Sujana Pathak is a female member of the Ananda Farmers' group in Belaka Municipality, Ward Number 4. She has a five-years old son, and her husband is working abroad. She decided to stay in the group to acquire new farming techniques and methods. Specifically, she developed a keen interest in bamboo and mushroom farming.

Being part of the farmers' group, she gained knowledge about nutrition and other related information. Sujana expressed her eligibility to receive various trainings and highlighted the ease of learning new things through discussions and information exchange within the group.

Sujana also informed us about the group's regular meetings on the 24th day of the Nepali monthly calendar. During these meetings, the group collects seed money and provides loans to members for their regular needs or agro-related businesses, nutritional food consumption, and more.

She shared her experience of the nursery development and Good Agricultural Practices training provided to them through the project run in partnership between Action Against Hunger (ACF) and Sahara Nepal which is funded by Phil good Foundation (Neuffize/OBC).

Sujana explained how her understanding of bamboo plantation changed during the training. Initially, she believed that one bamboo would produce one sapling, but she learned that each nodule could be nurtured to produce multiple saplings, thus increasing production.

She also mentioned learning about preparing bio-pesticides and seed preservation during the Good Agricultural Practices training.

As the landowner, Sujana's motivation to provide land for nursery development stemmed from the information about using bamboo for disaster resilience and the plan to provide it for municipal use. She further expressed that after joining the farmers' group, they used to rely on various pesticides, but through the training, they learned about utilizing cow dung and farmyard manure. They discovered the importance of creating a manure bed and covering it to prevent gas released while preparing manure at home. They also learned how to make manure using various other products alongside cow dung. Sujana concluded the conversation by expressing her hope to receive more training on NUCS (Neglected and Underutilised Crop Species) production in the future.

Unintended happiness of Dhan Bahadur by Biswas project

Dhan Bahadur lives in Bhadrapur Municipality, Jhapa. Primarily, he had an infection on his leg so he visited the nearest Health post and he was suspected of being suffered from leprosy and was referred to Mechi Zonal Hospital. He was identified to be suffered from leprosy. At that time he was only 12 years old. After the identification of the disease he was counseled by Doctors and instructed to take medicine. As per the instruction of the doctors he took medicine regularly for 24 months. He suffered from deformity when he ignored medicine intake as a result USG diagnosis confirmed that his leg was severely infected.

Dhan Bahadur laments that his childhood was not normal as other children enjoyed. He shares the pitiful moments when he had to alienate himself from his friends in playground because of the social stigma that leprosy was communicable disease. However, he was well supported by his family members and did not face such humiliation and discrimination at home.

Later, in the year 2060 BS, he got married and gave birth to two healthy and adorable children. Happiness comes with cost. Being a father, he felt relentless responsibility to support his family. But the burden of disease did not



allow him to secure financial resources for his family. He shares that due to his never healing like wounds he could never add up happiness in his family neither for his parents nor for his children.

One day Community Health Facilitator/Mobilizer (CHM) from Biswas project visited his house based on the information availed from health facility. The CHM provided counseling

to him and suggested to visit Aanandaban Leprosy Hospital in Lalitpur for further treatment. On 2079/3/11 Tuesday he visited Aanandaban Hospital and started his treatment from 2079/3/16. Surgery was applied for the first time on his severely infected leg. After 10 days of operation he recuperated and was discharged from the Hospital.

Dhan Bahadur expresses his sincere gratitude to Biswash Project. He says, "I never thought that my disease would ever heal and I will recover". Now he has acquired a new normal life. The disease which prevented him to conduct normal daily activities is all gone. Nowadays he supports his family in household chores and agriculture, partially engaging in economic activities as well. He adds up, "I am very happy now because my wound has stopped to infection after operation". He pledged the Biswas Project to support other people similar people who are suffered from the diseases so they can also be recovered and live their life happily.

Shiv Hasda was born in the year 2006 as the youngest son of mother Hassanmai Tudu and Father Muni Hasda in Ward No. 2 Sugabathan



of Jhapa Rural Municipality. The arrival of a son in the family was filled with happiness, along with the responsibility of his care and nurturing. Days passed by and Shiva also grew. But unfortunately a child's

growth and development did not seem to be at the speed it should have been. Even when Shiva was 14-15 years old, his physical condition was like that of a small child.

His physical condition created tension in the family. Parents started spending days in worry. Friends started looking at each other with teasing and contempt. Shiv and his parents were very upset when they heard some people of the village saying that "this boy will not be able to do anything". But what to do? They had no choice but to remain silent. If there is any cure for this problem, Shiva's parents also tried to understand people who knew and understood better in the community. But no one could tell the solution. Even if they thought that going to a big hospital would solve it, but they could not go there. Education and poverty were major obstacles in this. Due to not being able to find a solution for this and due to the insulting behavior of relatives and neighbors, Shiva's family felt isolated from the community. However, Shiva remained undeterred in his duty and on his path. There is still not enough trend of going to school in the Santhal community, although Shiva continued to advance his studies. Even though his classmates

did not care, he became a favorite student of the teachers. He was a good student, he was studying regularly, due to which he is going to study in class 12 today.

In this context, with the support of Habitat for Humanity Nepal and Sahara Nepal, Resilient Inclusive Sustainable Eastern Nepal program related to disaster management, Jhapa rural municipality ward no. 2. Shiva got informed that a community-based program on disaster management and risk reduction has been implemented in Sugabathan, with special priority given to women and persons with disabilities. It was interesting for him.

To facilitate this program, an inclusive community disaster management

committee was formed in Sungawathan, in which Shiva became a member. He started to work actively in the group. This committee is emphasizing the issue of gender and PWD inclusiveness in the context of DRR at community level. Now Shiva is feeling that his role in his society has increased. Her activism increased after this project oriented the committee towards the roles and responsibilities of women and persons with disabilities.

These days Shiva is found to be advocating for an inclusive society. To ensure the rights of people with disabilities, he shares ideas with the representatives of the ward and rural municipality offices. His role in the transformation of society seems to be increasing day by day. Although he and his family were worried about his

physical condition yesterday, today his family feels proud of him.

Shiva says "I am a student now. Furthering my studies is my first duty. Apart from this, I am also active in community disaster management work by taking time out. Yesterday I was worried about myself. But today, as a member of the Community Disaster Management Committee, my morale has increased. My thinking has changed after realizing that even disabled people can contribute a lot to the society. I would like to thank everyone involved in this program. I also help my parents in the farming work by arranging time. I didn't enjoy life before. Positive thoughts are coming to my mind now. I want to continue this way."





Spinning the wheel for financial betterment'

"My supportive husband actively helps me in running the shop, providing me the freedom to join the class and visit family members."

Kala Devi, a hardworking woman from the remote village of Jahada Rural Municipality, struggled to provide better life to her large family. Kaladevi, a forty-eight-year-old woman, and her husband, RabilalPaswan, parents of six children, were managing every day on little income from labor. Their every-day earnings of 500 rupees added up to a

monthly income of 15,000 rupees. Her family, however, ran into financial troubles during the rainy season, when employment opportunities became very uncommon.

In the midst of December 2022, Kaladevi learned about a Financial Literacy (FL) class being conducted in her area. The class was organized by SAHARA Nepal and facilitated by Ritisha Thapa, a local Community Facilitator. Intrigued by the opportunity to gain financial knowledge, Kaladevi eagerly enrolled in

the class along with 24 other trainees. Over the course of 14 days, from mid-December to early January, Kaladevi struggled to learn financial literacy and its importance in her life. She learned valuable information on 14 different topics that she felt were highly relevant to her life. Among them, the concept of saving struck her interest the most. Kaladevi recognized the potential of saving as a means to secure her family's future and ensure financial stability.

The FL classes concluded,

leaving Kaladevi feeling inspired and confident in her newfound knowledge. She opened up her own small shop, convinced that the knowledge she acquired during the training would propel her towards success. Fueled by determination, Kaladevi took the leap and witnessed her small soap shop flourish, becoming a reliable source of income that helped sustain her household.

Kaladevi's enthusiasm was contagious, and she eagerly shared her learning's with her family members. They attentively listened and embraced the principles she conveyed. Although Kaladevi hadn't maintained a daily logbook for her finances, she and her family committed

to managing their money in a more systematic manner moving forward. Her supportive husband, Rabilal, actively assisted her in running the shop, allowing Kaladevi the flexibility to visit her relatives whenever she desired.

To finance her small shop, Kaladevi sought financial assistance and secured a loan from nearby SACOSS. However, her thriving soap business enabled her to repay the loan without difficulty each month. Additionally, Kaladevi and her family members established saving accounts, contributing regularly to build a safety for their future. The FL classes also sparked Kaladevi's interest in insurance, particularly health insurance, and she expressed

a desire to explore this area further. Although she hadn't purchased a life insurance policy yet, Kaladevi recognized the importance of health insurance coverage.

Reflecting on her journey, Kaladevi regarded the FL class as a pivotal turning point in her life even at this age. The class inspired her to take charge of her family's financial well-being and motivated her to step forward as the leader of her household's financial affairs. Through determination, hard work, and the invaluable lessons she learned, Kaladevi emerged as a beacon of empowerment, proving that with the right knowledge and mindset, anyone can overcome financial challenges and create a better future.

Opinion







Background of the Organization

SAHARA Nepal is nongovernment organization (NGO) registered in accordance with the Section (4) of the Organization Registration Act 2034 BS and affiliated with the Social Welfare Council in accordance with the Section (13) of the Social Welfare Act 2049 BS of the Government of Nepal in 2051 BS (1994 AD). SAHARA is autonomous and not profit making non-governmental organization groomed from grass root level and led by young, dynamic and result oriented development professionals.

SAHARA- Nepal works along with the poor and marginalized people living at bottom of the society since 1994. 

The estimates also show that 26% of total infections are distributed among PWID (8%), MSM (9%), clients of sex workers (5%), MSW/TGSWs (3%), and FSWs (1%). There were 27,495 HIV positive cases identified and reported as of December 2015.</p> <p>Overall, HIV prevalence among FSWs has decreased compared to previous years.</p> <p>Nepal has made significant achievements to contain HIV epidemic. The HIV prevalence in adult population has dropped to 0.20% from a previous high of nearly 0.7% while new annual estimated infections have dropped to below 1,400 from a previous high of around 7,000 new infections per year. Access to HIV prevention, care, support and treatment services has increased significantly over the years. However, there are substantial challenges to the HIV response related to KPs despite some notable successes. Many KPs still do not have access to HIV testing or are unwilling to access current services because of stigma and discrimination. So far, Nepal has been able to diagnose nearly 70% of the individuals estimated to be infected with HIV. However, recent NCAASC reports shows that after adjusting for deaths and duplication, this drops to 57%. About 89% of those diagnosed have already been registered in care services. Nearly 12,000 (50%) of those in care are receiving Anti-Retroviral Therapy (ART) and reports suggest that 12-month retention of clients is 84%. 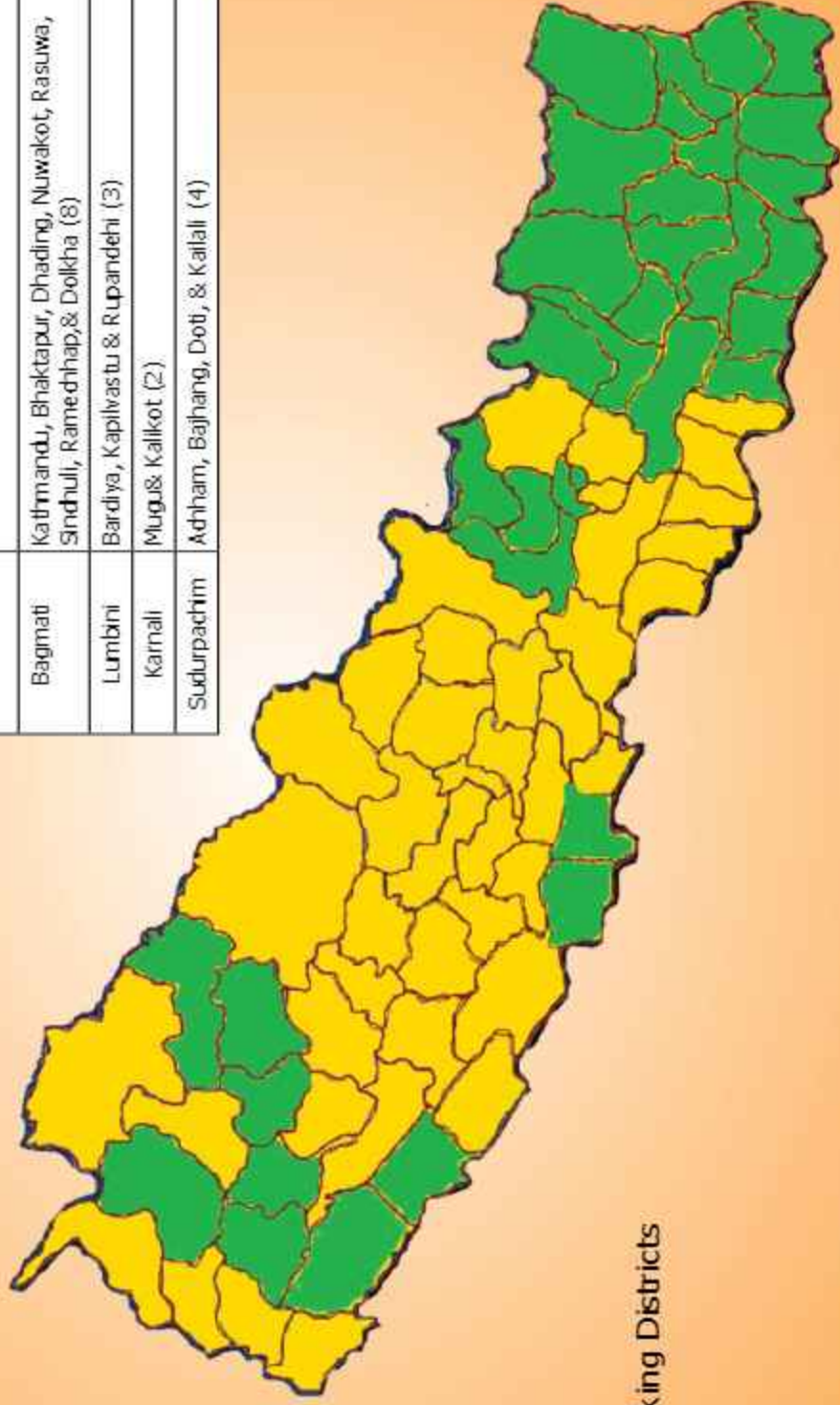
